# 2024 DPVC SWOT Analysis Summary 01/16/2024

The Democratic Party of Valencia County's Executive Committee along with Party members met on January 13, 2024, and conducted a SWOT Analysis of the DPVC. Below is a summary of our conclusions.

## Strengths

- 1. Ward organization
- 2. Leadership
- 3. Recent election success
- 4. DPNM provides many resources
- 5. Diverse and inclusive community
- 6. Core group of committed Dems
- 7. Communication channels including the Podcast and Newsletter

#### Action Items

- 1. Fill vacancies in leadership
- 2. Show appreciation to our leadership
- 3. Fully utilize DPNM resources
- 4. T3 Training for all Ward Chairs and EC members when available
- 5. Outreach should include personal phone calls

## Weaknesses

- 1. Party is fragmented and infighting has been an issue
- 2. Communication messaging, communications with sub-groups such as Hispanics, LGBTQIA+, AAPI, and others is lacking, DPVC doesn't have a presence in remote areas of the county.
- 3. Lack of engagement/small volunteer numbers
- 4. Hispanic underrepresentation and lack of engagement
- 5. Youth underrepresentation and lack of engagement
- 6. Leadership is newer to Valencia County lacks ties to traditional Valencia County Dems
- 7. Lack of permanent venue
- 8. Over planning

#### Action Items

- 1. If disagreements or concerns arise within the EC, deal with them on a one-to-one basis first, then follow a chain of command starting with the Chair, then the EC at large if that is not successful, and then DPNM involvement if needed.
- 2. Expand phone and in-person communications especially to underrepresented populations
- 3. Develop "rules of engagement" for meetings "attack ideas not people"
- 4. Mike will reach out to local unions as a possible source of a permanent venue
- 5. Keep our messaging and our focus on local issues
- 6. Utilize specific asks for both fundraising and volunteer requests
- 7. More vocal/visible advocacy for local issues

## Opportunities

- 1. Every election
- 2. Youth vote
- 3. Family and relatives
- 4. Elected officials' successes can be highlighted
- 5. Voter registration
- 6. Growing population for outreach
- 7. Large Decline to State pool
- 8. Coordinating with other county parties and organizations

#### Action Items

- 1. Outreach to youth voters utilizing County Clerk's data and listen to their needs
- 2. Utilize data to target populations that are underrepresented
- 3. Support VCFDW in their work to register young voters
- 4. Create door hangers, postcards, and other outreach tools
- 5. Re-engage registered Dems that have not been active in the Party
- 6. Partner with local businesses
- 7. Compile a list of Democratic owned businesses
- 8. Promote Jim Rickey's Newsletter
- 9. Hold town hall meetings throughout the county at the ward level
- 10. Create a list of Ward Chair duties/expectations
- 11. Get monthly lists of newly registered Dems and welcome them
- 12. Hold Ward meetings to reach all areas of the county
- 13. Utilize free advertising where available Food trucks, civic groups, artists, and musicians
- 14. Provide voter education on the history of Valencia County and current issues

### Threats

- 1. Churches promoting politics from the pulpit

- 3. Not countering negative messages
- 4. Them versus Us branding
- 5. Restriction of voter access
- 6. Insertion of xenophobia, antisemitism, and other biases into political debate
- 7. Infighting and Party divisions

- 9. Scarcity of fair communication venues in Valencia County
- 10. Lack of voter knowledge about civic engagement and its importance
- 11. Missing candidates for local positions

#### Action Items

- 1. As individuals, we can challenge the church vs. State infringements that happen in Valecia County
- 2. Branding for example "Democrats do good things".
- 3. Create and distribute messaging cards.
- 4. Outreach to liberal religious institutions locally.
- 5. Consider a resolution by the Executive Committee to support positive religious actions and service organizations in Valencia County
- 6. Update our messaging to meet local needs and concerns, create our own identity disavowing the GOP descriptions of Dems
- 7. Adopt a positive and forward-thinking tone
- 8. Utilize our limited resources for candidates to the fullest which may mean focusing on a few vital positions instead of trying to have a candidate for every position.
